#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

#### LED Lighting.

Councilman Diffendorf reported that the LED lighting is up. If anyone knows of a light that was not switched, contact the Town. This will be a big savings to the Town forever.

### Dog Control Report.

Katie Legg read the Dog Control Officer's report for January, which is on file in the Town Clerk's Office.

#### Insurance Update.

Councilman Weingartner reported that the PERMA Workers' Comp came in about \$10,000 less because we met the lowest threshold. The liability/casualty/fire package is being processed now and should be done in March.

# Water Break.

John Finch reported there was a water break last week in Five Mile Point; a 6-inch main. It was fixed within the day by town employees.

# Professional Fees Local Law; Driveway Culvert Pipes.

Mr. McKertich reported that he's working on a local law for professional consultant fees which should be ready shortly as well as the culvert pipe policy for driveways.

# Hiner Road Update.

Regarding the proposed road from Hiner to Krager, Supervisor Kniffen reported that, after making several attempts, we contacted the owner of the land involved, 34 acres. He said two sisters own the land and after he explained the situation to the sister that lives in Florida who called him today, she said they have no plans for the property but would like more information. Supervisor Kniffen will turn this over to the City.

Mr. Gordon said you can't get a backhoe in there for a burial because it's steep, and it's even hard for a hearse. They've only had one burial since 2017. Previously the property owner next to the cemetery allowed them to go through their property with a backhoe but there is a new owner who has blocked that off. They currently have about \$1,000 in their treasury. Supervisor Kniffen told them if they want to be considered for this they would have to provide proof that the cemetery is non-profit.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

39-20 Amendment – Kirkwood Housing Partnership Councilman Diffendorf moved to adopt resolution authorizing the Supervisor to sign the Certificate of Amendment of the Certificate of Limited Partnership of Kirkwood Housing Group, L.P., in accordance with the attached amendment. Councilman Grubham seconded.

**Discussion:** Mr. McKertich explained this is a transfer of ownership for the senior housing facility from one group to another and under State law, because of the type of facility it is, it requires approval of the Town Board and the Supervisor's signature. The new owner of this facility will be CRM Rental Management Inc., which is a New York corporation. They manage properties all over New York. At this point they haven't proposed any other amendments to the agreement.

#### **Discussion – Zoning Change – Francis Street.** (LCG)

Councilman Grubham said when we worked on the Comprehensive Plan one of the things we talked about was that we needed to try to get rid of the PUDs. We are going to meet again to go through these PUDs to change the zoning to get rid of them because they are too awkward to work with. At the time they made sense but they no longer do. After we meet we'll bring something back to the Board.

Discussion – Request from Windsor Human Development to have Doug's Fish Fry set up at Valley Park, on the bridge side, on Friday, March 13<sup>th</sup> from 11 am to 6 pm for a fundraiser. (GEK)

Supervisor Kniffen said this request for permission to set up at the park just came in today. The question is why they can't set up at Schneiders' Plaza since they just had one there last week on January 30<sup>th</sup>. Councilwoman Legg said this organization is in Windsor and they have a food pantry and do different things for the community. It was noted that this request doesn't fall into the usual category for fund raising at Valley Park, since the Parks Use Local Law addresses a charitable group that wants to reserve a pavilion for their fund raising efforts, not sponsor a food truck vendor. A concern was noted about winter weather conditions. This doesn't fall under the Peddlers & Solicitors Local Law either. Councilman Weingartner said Doug's Fish Fry will make money but the majority of the proceeds goes to the fundraiser sponsor. Other groups have done this in the past, but not at

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the park. Councilwoman Legg read a description of Windsor Human Development: Serves families located within the Windsor Central School District food on a monthly basis. All food distributed is purchased by the pantry, funding is through grants and local community fundraisers. She noted that this would set a precedent if this is approved. Councilman Grubham noted a concern about that as well and said it could expand to Veterans River Park and could involve both parks all year long. Although we don't want to tell non-profits no, where do you draw the line. Councilwoman Legg said if you were to have a softball game at Valley Park on a day that a non-profit was pre-scheduled, Valley Park is limited as it is. Mr. McKertich said if they are going to be doing this on Town property we need to make sure they have insurance, a health certificate and we need to know when they're going to be there. We should get an indemnity provision from them through an application process. Mr. McKertich will draft an application form.
